## PRESIDENT'S FOREWORD

The 2020 lifesaving season was arguably the period of greatest change in the Club's 70-year history. It was also one of our most successful, reflected in Lifesaving Victoria awarding Portsea SLSC the Marsh 2020 Victorian Club of the Year, receiving the Beaurepaire Shield for only the second time in its history. Congratulations to the many members who made a contribution this season - I hope that you feel proud to have contributed to an amazing season.

Following years of hard work and planning, we moved into the new Clubhouse which provided countless opportunities for members to engage, develop and enjoy each other's company, as well as provide an amazing base for delivering our lifesaving services.

The lifesaving year commenced with two very notable member recognition events. First, at our Annual General Meeting, immediate Past President Stuart Rayner was recognised with Life Membership of the Portsea SLSC, an honour richly deserved. Congratulations Stuart!

Further north, our very own Nat Hood was awarded Life Membership of Surf Life Saving Australia. Life membership is an honour awarded to surf lifesaving members who go above and beyond in their duties and responsibilities in the movement. Nat has been a prominent contributor within our own Club for over three decades, however it is her work elsewhere – which many within the Club may be unaware of – which has been a major contributor to her being awarded this honour. Nat is the first member of the Portsea Surf Life Saving Club to become a Life Member of SLISA. Congratulations Nat!

The establishment of our food and beverage facility – “The Club” – was probably the most significant change for the membership. Traditionally F&B at Portsea consisted of a few BBQ's over summer and an end of season celebration. Following an off-season of planning, in December we opened “The Club”, under the supervision of the Club's General Manager, Wayne Stoll. The Club operated weekends in December until Boxing Day, after which it operated 7 days per week, from 8am until late. From February, it operated on weekends until COVID-19 restrictions forced its close. The business was operated by the PSLSC.

“The Club” created much excitement among members and the local community. It drove five key outcomes:

- Engagement – engagement is the key theme of the PSLSC strategy, and The Club provided the backdrop to facilitate engagement on a daily basis through the peak season;
- Employment – the operations provided employment for 40+ members of PSLSC, predominantly in the 16 - 21 age group. For many it was their first job and an opportunity to enter the workforce and develop new skills in a familiar environment;
- Development – through The Club, we have created an avenue for providing further training and development opportunities to members, beyond lifesaving and leadership skills;

- Membership growth – we grew from 2387 members (2019) to just over 4200 members. This growth presents a fantastic opportunity for the Club;
- Commercial operations to fund delivery of lifesaving services – The Club provides an opportunity for PSLSC to raise funds to safeguard operations and maintain its assets.

We also saw the launch of a range of member engagement activities, including “Tribe” – a new initiative to include, celebrate, encourage and support a greater level of female involvement within the Club. We also ran Bridge classes and yoga and pilates classes across the summer peak season.

Our events team were able to expand both the Portsea Swim Classic and the Pier to Perignon swims, increasing numbers while also improving swimmer experience. The rate of returning swimmers at both is testament to the work that goes in to create such special events.

Our education and member development team were certainly kept busy. Through our formal education programs, we delivered development opportunities to almost 1,000

people, the vast majority under the age of 18. This comprised Nippers (545 people), SRC (93), Cadets (70), Bronze medallion (87, incl. 4 members of Mildura LSC), Silver Medallion (42), Part time bronze (22). Three new camps were also introduced - our new Advanced Rescue Camp (9), an IRB Drivers Camp (11) and a Lifeguard Training camp (15). These events contributed to Portsea's record 22 paid Lifeguards working on beaches across the Mornington Peninsula in 2020.

On the beach, our patrols recorded similar total patrol hours (6,164) and total rostered patrol hours (4,340) despite the fact the season was cut short due to COVID-19 restrictions. We also recorded our highest ever number of 100% patrol attendance (36 members – a 33% increase from last season). The overall quality of patrols was extremely high and I cannot thank enough all members who patrolled in season 2019/20. Once again, I am pleased to report no lives lost.

The latter stages of the construction of the new Clubhouse continue to be reflected in the Club's financial statements. Overall the Club is in a strong position financially, with relatively few remaining rebuild-related expenses remaining. Of these, the eastern pathway/courtyard project is the last, which we hope to complete prior to Christmas.

The Club remains circa \$300k short of its fundraising target, which we are seeking to complete, or alternatively, looking at other means of reaching this target. Pleasingly, pledges continue to come in and we are confident that almost all will be realised in the coming few years.

Major income items remain membership, which increased significantly, the Club's open water swim events and its Nipper program. In its COVID-19 shortened opening season, the food and beverage division operated at a small

loss, mainly attributable to higher than expected staff costs and a reliance on agency staff.

The increased depreciation figure (\$357k) saw the Club record an operating loss of \$304k. Including non-operating income, the Club recorded an operating surplus of \$581k. The Club's major debt remains the Portsea SLSC Foundation (\$780k).

As I write this report in July, Melbourne and the Mornington Peninsula communities remain greatly impacted by the impact of coronavirus and the health and economic crises this has created. We are hugely conscious that across our membership, people have been impacted in different ways. At this stage it is very difficult to predict how it may impact our operations in season 2020/21, however we are actively planning around a range of scenarios across patrols, education, major events and food and beverage operations.

It was our first season in the new Clubhouse, and it was certainly the busiest season that I've been involved in.

We kicked off with our first camps in the new Clubhouse in September, with IRB Drivers and Silver Camps. We then started to deck out the equipment room in preparation for the lifesaving season and kicked off our first patrols in the new Clubhouse. Unsurprisingly, we had some great patrol attendance! Sitting in the control room is certainly a step up from the shipping containers.

We opened up our new food and beverage service, and The Club became the prime location for socialising on the peninsula. We also provided employment for a range of young clubbies. Bronze Camp went off without a hitch, and we ran the rest of our programs as usual over the peak period, in Nippers, SRC and Cadets. We raised double what we have before at the annual door knock, and the cocktail party was a huge hit with hundreds piling in for it. Multiple interstate coaches supported our competition team, and we posted a range of awesome results throughout the season. The Portsea Tribe program designed to engage females in lifesaving was kicked off, and a range of clubbies enjoyed our new yoga, pilates and bridge offerings. It was a shame that our patrolling and competition seasons were cut a bit short, but we fitted plenty in over the peak months to make up for it!

Thank you to everyone who was involved in all aspects of the Club this season, and a special thanks as always to our active members who patrolled the dangerous waters of Portsea Back Beach. After three seasons as Club Captain, the time has come for me to pass the baton on. When I started, I had three clear goals that I'd like to revisit now - they were retention, transition, and competition.

**Retention** was about creating clear pathways in the Club for junior members, allowing them to stay involved in the Club, throughout and beyond their teen years. The number of teenagers and young adults in their 20s that we now have involved in the Club is something that I'm very proud of, and also something that I think we should continue to work on.

I would like to conclude by thanking all members for their ongoing support of the Club, and their participation in its activities. In particular, to all those who have been part of subcommittees or have taken on leadership positions across the Club I say thank you. Finally, I would like to pay special thanks to outgoing Club Captain Matt Perrott for everything he has done over the past three years in the role. He has been an exceptional leader, and a great personal support to me.

I look forward to seeing you all soon, and like you I am sure, truly hope we are in a position to engage in the Club and its activities later in the year.

One person I'd particularly like to call out is our current President. Matty has had his own rollercoaster ride to manage, but I brought him along with mine as well this last season, and his help and guidance has always been so appreciated. He's become a great mentor and a great friend.

I'm really excited about the future at Portsea Surf Lifesaving Club. The number of talented young leaders who we have in our midst is incredible. One of those

## GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

The 2019/2020 season was the most exciting and rewarding season that I've experienced at the Club in my thirty five years of membership. Reflecting now on the season, what I enjoyed the most was seeing so many existing and returning active members and new social and family members enjoying our new Clubhouse and all the new initiatives that were launched in the season. The Club had something for everyone to enjoy, regardless of age and membership category. It was a year to experiment, launch new initiatives and take key learnings into the coming seasons.

Going into the season there was a shared concern that we needed to maintain the great history and inclusive culture of the Club. We did not want to let our new facility change what we all individually and collectively love about the Club and what keeps bringing us back to Mt Levy year after year - lazy afternoons on the deck, timeless sunsets, mateship and camaraderie, President's Clubs and more. I'd like to think that we succeeded in preserving our unique club culture while welcoming in excess of 1800 new members to share our passion for the Club.

I'd like to highlight some of the new initiatives that took place over the season, including:

- Launch of 'The Club' - A food and beverage business that catered for breakfast, lunch, dinner and a bar service over the peak season, achieving revenue of \$500,000 and employing over forty young members;
- The launch of Tribe - a new initiative to include, celebrate, encourage and support a greater level of female involvement within the Club. A Tribe female team swim was introduced at the Portsea Swim Classic. Tribe will be the key platform for increasing female involvement at PSLSC;
- Under the leadership of Jodie Madden the Club created a Member Engagement portfolio on the Committee to expand the range of activities on offer to members. A member engagement plan was developed, which saw a number of new events created. These included Bridge classes (276 tickets sold), yoga and Pilates classes twice daily in summer and a new members' welcome event;
- The 2020 Nipper Cocktail party achieved record high ticket sales of almost 500 tickets and was possibly the best ever;
- A courtesy golf cart was set up to ferry people requiring assistance between the carpark and

the club. A courtesy bus service was also provided covering Portsea, Sorrento and Blairgowrie; and

- The club ran a successful Boot Camp and sleepover for fifty five Nippers from the Under 13 age group.

It certainly was a jam-packed calendar that was full of very memorable events and many key learning experiences.

The coming season brings many challenges including the as-yet unknown impact of COVID-19 restrictions. Nonetheless the show will go on and we will adapt and plan around the limitations we are faced with. In the leadup to the new season, with the aid of our member activation program, we will be conducting training courses for members to develop skills enabling them to work at The Club:

- Barista courses – to be held at Veneziano Coffee Roasters in Richmond during the September School holidays to give budding baristas and potential staff members a chance to improve their employment opportunities; and
- RSA Course (Responsible Service of Alcohol) – we will be announcing details of an RSA course potentially to be conducted at the Club or an alternate city location in the lead up to summer for those interested in working behind the bar.

I will also be asking a small group of members to actively assist me on a Food and Beverage Sub Committee to develop the strategy for the 20/21 season and play an active role in its implementation.

At this stage our aim will be to open The Club facility in Spring however these plans will be subject to prevailing COVID-19 restrictions. Once we have a clearer picture of any limitations we will have to contend with, we will issue our plans for the season and other initiatives in e-Boomers so you can plan your next visit.

I look forward to presenting our plans for the season to you all soon and can't wait to welcome you back to The Club for a drink on the deck.

## SECRETARY'S REPORT

After a few years of intense activity surrounding the clubhouse rebuild project, where patrols were run out of shipping containers in the car park, club members may have been looking forward to a more mellow season in 2019-2020 to ease into the new clubhouse. In fact, the opposite happened, with frenetic levels of activity due to "The Club" coming into full operation, the introduction of a range of new club activities and an influx of new members.

The amount of work that went into setting up "The Club" in the last few months of 2019 was phenomenal. Challenges included defining the F&B offering, designing menus, buying equipment and supplies, establishing kitchen procedures, identifying and negotiating agreements with suppliers, setting up the club to enable it to take on employees for the first time, recruiting, onboarding and training staff and setting up systems to cater for ordering, booking, staff rostering and point of sale.

Wayne Stoll's experience as a restaurateur was invaluable and he guided the process through to a conclusion that created lifetime memories over the summer. Wayne has led several post-season reviews of The Club operations and he will be implementing a range of further improvements when the club opens next, including a revised service plan, improvements for managing staff costs and new controls over building access.

Although we had anticipated an upsurge of interest in new members joining the club once the clubhouse rebuild was complete, the level of new demand took everyone by surprise. By the end of the season we had welcomed 1,800 new members into the club: a 75% increase over the previous year, placing Portsea close to three times the size of next-largest Victorian SLSC. Such an influx of new members stretched our small administration team to its limits and I would especially like to acknowledge the work of Bec Kiss in managing the hundreds of new membership applications and sponsor references with patience and dedication.

Coupled with the completion of the clubhouse, the arrival of new members stimulated plenty of discussion about our membership policies. This topic generates strong views and I spent much of the summer fielding a diverse range of opinions from members and non-members alike about how the club's membership policies should operate. All this input, as well as the input received in response to an invitation in a recent e-Boomer was fed into the Committee's annual review of our membership policies. This year the Committee plans to present several recommendations for updates to membership policies at the Annual General Meeting.

The club is developing new ways to involve members, to provide additional volunteering opportunities commensurate with the increase in membership numbers. With the exception of the F&B service, Portsea is a volunteer-run club and as our size increases so does the amount of work required to keep it running smoothly. Openings are advertised in the e-Boomer regularly and we

have a register containing names of people who have offered to get involved. We encourage all members to contribute to the club through volunteering.

Over the past year we have continued our mission to improve the club's administrative processes. Club Treasurer Angelo Biviano oversaw our move to a new financial accounting system, Xero, which will provide improved reporting and budget management, as well as improved integration with F&B systems such as our staff rostering system and payroll. Club Captain Matt Perrott has invested many hours into researching and implementing a new membership management system which we hope to transition to this year. The new system will provide a far superior user experience for members and provide improved membership and event management features..

While all this activity was happening, the Club faced a couple of unexpected bureaucratic challenges. Updating our liquor licence proved to be less than straightforward, necessitating us to operate under a temporary licence until early February, before our long-term licence was granted. We also dealt with a point of confusion over the club's not-for-profit registration with the ACNC. Jeremy Smith and his team at Gaden's Lawyers navigated the club through this issue with skill and were able to demonstrate that the confusion was on the part of the ACNC and not the club. I would like to acknowledge the generous support provided Jeremy this year on this and all the other questions I have pushed his way.

Another surprising event that challenged us in new ways was of course the COVID-19 pandemic. The Committee met regularly to consider the latest news and guidance on COVID-19 and is grateful to LSV for regular and comprehensive updates. Aside from the risks to the health of our members, the Committee is monitoring risks to the club's major revenue sources, which include events like the Swim Classic and Pier to Perignon. We are conscious that these events could be impacted by COVID-19 restrictions and we will continue to make contingency plans to mitigate these risks as far as possible. As part of our response the Committee has appointed a COVID-19 Officer and we are pleased that Dr Natalie Hood has agreed to take on that role.

The Committee continued to function well in 2019-2020. We have cultivated a strong sense of inclusion and cooperation within the group and all opinions are valued. The club is compliant with all legislative and regulatory requirements, all our record-keeping is fully electronic and up to date and we have introduced regular succession planning sessions. We were able to transition to online Committee meetings seamlessly once the COVID-19 pandemic restrictions came into force.

Matt Mahon led a stream of work focused on improving aspects of the club's governance arrangements, resulting in the creation of several new sub-committees. The first is a Judiciary Committee, which will be chaired by Mark Grooby and will operate independently of the Committee. We are also establishing an Audit and Risk Committee, a



Building Services sub-committee and a Food and Beverage sub-committee to garner the required expertise to manage these functions appropriately and to spread the workload among volunteers.

This year sees the end of the Committee careers of several members who have played major roles over the past several years. Andrew Hewitt's planned one-year term as Deputy President will finally come to an end after five years. Hewy's wisdom and humour will be missed. Matt Perrott and Nick Tissot have each invested years of energy and commitment in the club Committee and will be handing over their roles to others at the AGM. Hamish McKendrick will vacate the Equipment Director role after overseeing the fitout of the clubhouse and managing the club through the build process. Jodie Madden resigned from her Committee role in June, having successfully implemented several new initiatives for members.

Each of these retiring members have made unique contributions to the operation and success of the club and on behalf of all club members I thank them for their dedication and commitment.

The Committee's focus for next year is set in line with the club's strategy. We will continue to work to involve all members actively in the club. There is still a lot of work to be done in fine-tuning the operation of "The Club" and the Committee will continue to pursue its agenda of upgrading its management systems and governance procedures - and of course we will continue to closely monitor the constraints brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic and modify our operations accordingly..

Again this year I would like to recognise Ian Campbell for his contribution as our Club Historian. Ian's relentless pursuit of club memorabilia and historical artefacts has resulted in a valuable record of the club's evolution. His continued work in publishing the club's annual reports is also greatly appreciated.

Thank you also to our club administrator Emmaline Paterson, whose work behind the scenes keeps our records and administration in order.

There is a lot for club members to look forward to over the coming season. Here's hoping that the COVID-19 pandemic is brought under control rapidly and that we can enjoy an uninterrupted summer.

### **Memorabilia for the new clubhouse**

COVID-19 brought any work on the fit-out of the club to a shuddering halt. The club was in the early stage of purchasing a display cabinet, a project that will continue in the future.

### **The year ahead.**

The task of sorting through the many uncatalogued boxes of memorabilia that are located in the LSV off-site archive was slated as the main task for 2019/2020 however a change of physical storage was implemented which meant this effort was put on hold. ## LIFE SAVING DIRECTOR'S REPORT

The 2019/2020 lifesaving season will be one to remember for the good and the bad! The season started with the excitement of patrolling out of our new clubhouse and finished abruptly when it was cut short by two weeks due to the COVID-19 pandemic. I would like to thank our active membership for their flexibility and support during such a strange and action-packed season.

The highly functional and comfortable nature of the new clubhouse was a testament to the years of hard work and careful planning from the building sub-committee. Patrol set up time was greatly improved by the easy beach access and organised equipment room. Our new patrol room with panoramic views of the beach also enabled our patrol teams to sign on and discuss the conditions of the beach prior to patrol. The members day patrol room was also incredibly useful for our patrollers to escape the weather on those raining and windy southerly days, a luxury that our patrollers have missed for a number of years now.

This season, we were proud to implement a number of new systems to improve our patrolling capabilities. Firstly, a patrolling sub-committee was created, which was made up of four lifesaving development coordinators and two lifeguard development coordinators. Our lifesaving development coordinators (Oscar Hunter, Griffin Mitchell, Steph Hunter and Lachie Dowling) were responsible for running training sessions to help enhance the patrolling ability of active members of all skill levels. Our lifeguard development coordinators (Sas Mcnamara and James Tissot) ran a development camp for current and future lifeguards, helping create a clear pathway for the future generations of Portsea lifeguards. This was an excellent initiative that has helped increase the quality and number of lifeguards from Portsea. In fact, this season Portsea had twenty two paid lifeguards, which is the largest representation of Portsea lifeguards in recent history and was the most from any club on the Peninsula this season.

We also utilized technology this season to help improve our patrolling capabilities. With the help of Club Captain Matt Perrott, we created an online sign in system, making patrol sign on much more efficient and accurate. The installation of a high-tech camera also enabled our patrollers to zoom in and view beach patrons at London bridge or check on swimmers out the back in the surf.

Lastly, I would like to thank the patrol leadership team made up of our patrol captains, vice-captains and mentors. Your support and hard work throughout the season was incredible and is greatly appreciated.

This was the first year that our Silver candidates were provided with the opportunity of obtaining their First Aid award on the camp. After several days of exhilarating water-work, intense theory and leadership development, all forty one candidates obtained their IRB crew, Advanced Resuscitation Techniques and First Aid awards. We would like to extend a big thank you to Harry Paynter and Massimo Pallilo, who once again demonstrated outstanding leadership capabilities as senior instructors on this program, alongside all the other instructors and helpers who made this terrific camp possible.

Next, Jim Unkles and Henry Kiss proceeded to run another very successful Part-Time Bronze course with a record high of twenty two candidates. Candidates ranging from fifteen to sixty one years of age enjoyed the composure of Camberwell Hockey Club to the excitement of Portsea Back Beach in their journey of obtaining their Bronze Medallions. We would like to thank all who were involved in the planning, execution and assessment for making such an engaging and inclusive program possible.

To kick start the summer, Bronze Camp took place with Claire Tucker-Morrison at the helm for the second year in a row, alongside Tom Meysztowicz. Characteristically, an incredible week of water-work, practical and theoretical content was provided for our Bronzies. For the first time, a compulsory leadership development course was implemented for all instructors to enhance the quality of education delivered to all eighty seven participants. Additionally, creative forms of expression and relaxation, such as, yoga were employed to provide relief for the participants from the high-intensity nature of the camp. Our Environmental Education Program was selected as a finalist in the Life Saving Victoria Awards of Excellence, Innovation award. I would like to thank Brett Croft and the Nipper team for welcoming these ideas and supporting their implementation.

The Sustainability sub-committee aims to seat members representative of our membership and provide a leadership pathway for members. Our five Sustainability Officers for the 20/21 season are: Jane Byrne, Amy Quinlan, James Tissot, Tom Nelson and Flynn Chable. I am thankful to the

## COMPETITION REPORT

Aquatic Sport is an avenue for our members to train, race and socialise whilst at the same time, building surf skills and maintaining fitness levels that see them develop into some of our club's finest patrollers. In addition, our parent group also enjoys the camaraderie that goes with supporting our competitors in roles of officials, managers, coaches, selectors and administrators.

Portsea Competition Team in 2019/2020 proudly comprised:

- Juniors – 55 competitors (38 at State Titles)
- Youth – 20 competitors (10 entered to Aussie's)
- Seniors – 10 competitors (5 entered to Aussie's)
- IRB – 4 winter competitors in training
- Boaties – 4 rowers and their passionate sweep/coach, Stephen Blewett (entered to Aussies)
- Masters – 20 competitors (1 entered at Aussie's)
- Ski paddlers – 5 competitors
- Pool lifesaving – we are not yet active in this area

Our pre-season program started with a training weekend at Hampton LSC under the guidance of our Juniors' coach, nationally-profiled Ironwoman Courtney Hancock. Our kids happily featured on the nightly news with Courtney and club captain, Matt Perrott! We then held regular Sunday training at Hampton, and our inaugural Comp Team sleepover on the Sunday night of Cup weekend.

With such a start to the season, the Portsea Competition Team hoped to consolidate its position as a new force to be reckoned with in the aquatic sports arena. The resurgence started small, seven years ago, with our current president Matt Mahon, heading up a Junior (nipper) Competition Team, debuting at the LSV Victorian Junior Championships. In the years that have followed, those juniors have grown up, and members of that original cohort are still competing and successfully representing themselves, their club and their state, at lifesaving competitions. The team has grown along the way, both with athletes feeding in at the bottom end, and drawing new athletes into the team from our pool of older existing members.

The racing season started with the Victorian Endurance Championships, a series of long distance events, swim, board, ski and run. Portsea sent a team to Mornington and competed in all age groups, from U12 through to Masters, with representatives in every discipline. Portsea's strength was definitely in the swimming events with medals galore being won by our ocean swimmers in tough, stormy conditions.

We also had a small contingent trial for the Victorian State Team, racing off at Fairhaven, and then at the first Youth/Senior State carnival at Ocean Grove. Congratulations to Tom Regan and Xavier Purcell who were selected to pull on the Victorian navy cap.

The carnival season got off to a great start with a number of pennants won by the team at Ocean Grove, the Youth swimmers Mackie Hunter, and Xavier Purcell winning their respective surf races.

Come January, the team moved into our summer of intensive training and racing. Highlights included:

- Courtney Hancock returning for our second training weekend, including sessions at both the Backbeach and Quarantine.
- A team trip to Mornington for the Kozii Iron Event, a series of four races, swim, board and run each time round. Twenty junior and youth competitors attended and enjoyed more race day coaching from Courtney; a number of them coming home with medals;
- A 'summer soirée' fundraiser hosted by Glennis and Jason Winnett, where adults got to meet Courtney and each other without the kids around. A very big thankyou to those who supported the event and donated and bid for raffle prizes. Glennis and Jason are keen to host this event again in season 2020/2021;
- The Junior Competition team ran our Nippers' Competition day. Despite some challenges as the course was set out to LSV distances, our Junior Competition kids excelled. The longer distances meant some Nippers were challenged but water safety volunteers ensured all were always safe;
- Two days later, our Juniors successfully ran our own competition at Quarantine with Pt Leo and Mornington. It was excellent to have the local teams together (our kids had raced with them a few days earlier at Kozii). With 100 competitors, it proved to be a viable alternative to travelling over the bay to an official LSV carnival. There is support for this to become a regular fixture on our season calendar;
- A ferry pilgrimage to Anglesea for Youth and Seniors, once again in the worst of winter conditions. We took a racing team of 30 competitors, water, boat and beach. Stars of the show were Griffin Mitchell and Oscar Hunter who took a clean sweep in the U19 running events bringing home eight pennants between them. Our women's boat crew debuted at Anglesea and in very testing conditions placed second to Lorne, who are one of the best crews in the country. The Portsea Estate sponsored "June Ross" surfboat has proven to be an exceptional craft and we cannot thank Will Ross and family enough for their generosity;
- A five day training intensive hosted by Rhett Collie, a professional coach from Queensland, who ran multiple back and front beach sessions for juniors and seniors, culminating with our Senior Club Champs, successfully conducted by Nick Tissot in massive surf conditions;
- Portsea Swim Classic saw a large turnout of comp team members helping with event set up, pack up and racing; the team's best swimming results being Harvey Larke winning the U18 men, followed by Tom Regan in 2nd, and in the U18 women, Mackie Hunter 3rd and Steph Hunter 4th. This year, Portsea Juniors targeted the Portsea Swim instead of the LSV carnival at Mordialloc, enjoying the friendly racing at our club event.
- The Mordialloc Youth/Senior Carnival was the Sunday after Swim Classic and was attended by 16 of our youth competitors. The U14 Swim Team of Frankie Dever, Gemma Woolrich, Hannah Saadie and Mackie Hunter was a standout, winning the Youth (U15) Swim Team event. The three U15 youth boys, Ned Betts, Xavier Purcell and Harvey Larke teamed up with a friend from Anglesea for another winning result in the Youth Men's Swim Team, then raced the iron, with all three boys placing in the top 6. Over in the U17 women's arena, our team of Sophie Courtney, Georgie Kerr, Chloe Dowling, Manna Johnson and Steph Hunter won a swag of pennants in the team events, including the U17 Belt Race event and the U19 Rescue Tube Rescue Race;
- January finished with the Australia Day Long Weekend Youth and Senior Interstates Competition which was held on the Sunshine Coast. This year we had two Portsea competitors in the Victorian Team, Tom Regan in the U19 team and Xavier Purcell in the U15 team. Racing as a 16 year old in the U19 events, Tom had an amazing third placing in his speciality event, the Surf Race. Xavier and his team mate caught a cracking wave from the cans to place third in the U15 Board Rescue event at the Youth Pathway Cup. The following day Xavier competed again, for Portsea this time, at the Maroochydore Carnival, with over 700 competitors, placing 9th in both the U15 iron and swim events. These were amazing results and great racing experience for both these young Portsea members;
- February saw our Masters team, under the captaincy of Dwight Harrison, once again put our club front and centre stage at Lorne. Unfortunately, the howling easterly, and nowhere to hide, saw the majority of water events cancelled at the Masters Champs and the Youth/Senior carnival the next day;
- Our Juniors and Youth were thrilled to have Courtney Hancock back for a full weekend of training before States. Training was held at Elwood beach on Friday night and Saturday morning, plus Saturday afternoon at Portsea back beach. Courtney then joined the Junior team at Pt Leo LSV carnival on the Sunday;
- The Junior team was lucky enough to compete at States before COVID-19 lockdowns intervened. Courtney was on hand for the whole weekend to give encouraging words to kids on the start line and after races. This was greatly appreciated by the competitors and was the envy of other clubs. Portsea came away with 26 medals (9 gold, 5

silver & 12 bronze – 11 from team events and 15 from individuals). Gold medallists were: U9 Girls: Sarah Jacka, Sarah Hall, Luci Murchie, Millie Bar; U12 Girls: Sophie Jacka, Maggie Betts, Mia Hoskins, Annabelle Mahon, Bella Murchie; and U13 Girls: Anabelle Croft, Katie Kerr, Neve O'Callaghan, Cleo Richardson. On top of this we made an additional 29 finals (14 team events and 15 individual events). Overall, Portsea finished 8th out of 30 clubs which is an amazing result given we had 38 competitors. We also competed in the March Past for the first time in 16 years; much to LSV's approval.

- As the rest of our Comp team regrouped for the final month of solid training before Vics and Aussies, the COVID-19 pandemic arrived and led to the cancellation of remaining events for the Youth/Senior season, meaning no Victorian nor Australian Titles were held in the year 2020. A team of 21 athletes was entered at the Australian Championships, with representatives in the U14/15 Youth Aussies, the U17 age group and the surf boat events. Despite the obvious disappointment, the team will take heart in knowing that we have a tight-knit group of committed athletes who will bounce back for more next year.
- The LSV awards of Excellence saw two of our teams named winners of "Team of the Year" in the Sports Awards section: The Youth Women's Swim Team of Mackie Hunter, Gemma Woolrich, Hannah Saadie and Frankie Dever, along with the Masters Beach Relay Team of Dwight Harrison, Brett Croft, Henry Kiss and Darren Kerr. Congratulations to these teams.

Our main challenge and opportunity now is to use the COVID-19 lockdown to get more parents to complete their online LSV training to become officials. Whilst meeting the LSV criteria at Junior State Champs (with Venus Bay SLSC filling an IRB shift), many parents had to double up on roles – which was not ideal and an area we need to address for the upcoming season.

Our key Competition plans for season 2020/2021 are:

- Combined oversight of Junior, Youth and Senior Competition teams – for consistency, and to enable training based on ability not just age group;
- Running our season from October to April – enabling surf lifesaving to be an appealing option as a competitor's chosen summer sport (combining running, swimming, board, ski and rowing skills); and
- Committee meetings monthly year round.

Our Portsea Competition Team is appreciative of the support it receives from both the Club Committee and general membership, both in terms of man-power and financially, towards the costs of coaching, carnivals and equipment. Thanks goes to all the parents, partners and siblings who have helped throughout the season with carnival duties, team administration, training sessions, water safety and fund-raising. Competition is one of the pillars of a strong club and we look forward to proudly representing Portsea again in 2021.

### **Masters Competition Report**

Our Portsea Team was again one of the largest and strongest teams we have fielded. There was a great turn out by other clubs with a total field of around 400 competitors across all age brackets. Lorne turned the surf on, with a gale force easterly kicking the surf up to 3 to 4 foot sets.

The day started with the ski events. Our men's ski team did well picking up two silvers in double ski races to kick start our medal haulage - Matt Mahon and Pete Flockart in 45+ and Dave Flockart and Charlie "Chuck" Schall-Riaucour in 50+. Then there was absolute carnage in the following ski races as the wind and swell built.

Our two female Master competitors, Annabel White and Lyndall Willis set the pace in the women's water area. Both Annabel and Lyndall picked up their first ever Gold medals in Masters in their age groups in the Surf Tube Race, a gutsy effort in massive surf conditions. Then Annabel won another two Gold Medals in the 35-39 years Board Race and Surf Race - what an amazing effort and great for us to have had her join our club. The Baywatch Producers would have been impressed with our girls! Board races started and again more carnage The racing was tough and the poor bay clubs struggled in the conditions. In true style the Portsea team dominated in the heavy conditions, with Simon Traynor winning Bronze in the 45-49 years Board Race and John Vains winning Gold in the 60-64 years Board Race before all water events were cancelled due to the heavy surf conditions. Unfortunately Cam Hunter, Rob Mellor, Anthony Purcell and Dwight Harrison were unable to race in their main swim, board and team water events, ski team and taplins events; which saw our medal count in the water arena down on previous years. That means we'll see them all back next year!

With water events stopped, beach events then started. Rowan "Horse" Cameron did well to start the beach medal haulage with Silver in the 60-64 years Beach Flags. Henry "Twinkle Toes" Kiss won Silver in the 50-54 Beach Sprint, with Brett Croft the Bronze, and Michael "Whippy" Wilson Silver in the 70-74 years Beach Sprint, only ten seconds slower than Henry (seemed longer)!

Next came the relays, where heats were run and Horse pulled a calf after running the fastest 25m of his age sprint so Dwight was thrown in to replace him for the combined 200+ years beach relay. The team, consisting of the Tiger "Crofty", "Spotty No t-shirt Kerr", "Dwighty" and Henry, smashed all other eight teams to take home GOLD. The team then celebrated with drinks at Lorne Surf Club and dinner at Lorne Pub. A great day, night and weekend, great team bonding and the Portsea Masters served the Club well. ## MAJOR EVENTS

### Portsea Swim Classic

The Portsea Swim Classic continues to grow and attract swimmers from around the state and nationally. The 2020 Portsea Swim Classic has been the most successful event both in competitor numbers and financially for the club since its inception. The 2020 event continued the steady growth in entries with total swimmers numbering 2,500.

On the 18<sup>th</sup> January 2020 Portsea S.L.S.C. once again took over Pt. Nepean National Park. We were greeted with a stiff easterly breeze but an otherwise fine and mild 23 degree day. These conditions presented moderate seas for competitors who lapped them up and had a thoroughly enjoyable swim cementing the Portsea Swim Classic as an iconic event and what most believe and comment to be the best swim on the summer swim calendar.

2020 was the fifth year in which we have run the Portsea Swim Classic gold event, being a 2.5 km swim from the east of the Portsea hotel into the quarantine station. Once again Point Nepean's resident dolphins joined the swimmers to make the swim that much more enjoyable and an experience not to be rivalled. ### Pier to Perignon

Who would have thought when The Humble Founders kicked this little swim off in 1989 that thirty two years later it would have evolved into this mammoth yet still 'community-feeling' swim?

The weather was looking okay with a brisk southerly (off-shore) wind expected and a chilly 22° with the chance of a shower or two. In reality the wind was predominantly from the South East, a handy following breeze with a rapidly increasing ebb tide.

The rego tent opened at 9am and we were immediately hit with the locals getting in to register before the "Day Trippers" arrived. The crowd eased off after 10am then at 11am it got serious with queues for registration stretching down to the water line.

Kay & Burton staff were there to assist with setup as is their commitment to our premier swimming event. New sponsor People4Ocean (P4O) had their tent up offering a sunscreen service to all who passed by.

The huge water safety crew were evident at the southern end of the beach preparing to ensure our safety on the swim towards The Heads. Portsea is indebted to Dromana and Brighton Life Saving Clubs who contribute craft and crew; Life Saving Victoria for two jet skis organised through our own Hamish McKendrick, and finally, the Southern Peninsula Rescue Squad crew for bringing their two boats: SP01 and SP02, for the majority of the day.

The aerial display this year featured three Yak 52's that made several line abreast passes over the start line and a series of in line 'bombing' runs along the beach, providing quite a level of excitement five minutes before the race start.

We all have our warm-up, or cool-down process, so as the 12:05 departure time was approaching many swimmers started to acclimatise for the upcoming swim. Regrettably the ferry was late departing, leaving some of us (your correspondent included) shivering on the shore line waiting for the start. Finally, with the ferry off and away to Queenscliff, the host/announcer Graham Wells, along with K&B's Liz Jensen, blasted the start on the hooter and we were off.

With a tail wind, and despite Graham's warning that Pt King was going to be a challenge, it did take many swimmers by surprise and a very sharp, choppy fifteen minutes later we emerged onto the Shelley Beach section thankful that Pt King was behind us.

The next 2km along Shelley Beach prepares you for the final Pt Franklin section where I saw a couple of huge rays before turning left into the Portsea Front Beach and the welcome finish archway.

The walk up the hill to the Portsea Camp was a bit tougher than I was used to in previous years, going up onto the Newton reserve, but after finally cresting the hill the sight of the Oval was a joy to behold.

A vote of thanks to the finish area staff for preparing a magnificent place to relax, have a fresh fruit drink from Tom & Emma's, a just-the right-size muffin from Baked In Portsea and fresh fruit from Sciclunas. The Portsea chefs were dishing up Democracy Sausages in white bread while new offerings this year included coffee from Café Alfresco and a BBQ loaded with Hamburgers, Steaks and Schnitzels from BBQ Temptations and a beer or wine.

The Portsea club would like to thank the Portsea Camp for stepping in to provide the new venue after the Portsea Beach was declared off-limits by the shire council due to significant erosion that rendered the previous venue unusable. The move to this new site was skilfully managed by our P2P Director Craig Evans at very little notice.

Major places in the 2020 swim were taken by now four times winner Sam Sheppard who romped across the line in a time of 31:48 which is now the fastest finish time in the thirty two year history of the event. Is Sam a better swimmer now than previous years or was the tide extremely advantageous? First female to complete the swim, and finishing 4<sup>th</sup> overall was Rebecca Foxton in a time of 38:20. In the 'Non Wetti' class, first male place was filled by Mark Grooby in 38.50 and first female spot was taken by Grace Hyslop in 38.56.

The Founders Trophy was picked up by Robbie in 50:53, his first win in ten years over Ted who completed the swim in 59:25. A cheeky explanation (by Ted), of Ted's loss was provided during the speeches - an explanation not accepted by most in the audience.

A great speech by Club President Matt Mahon, recognising and honouring the efforts of Ted & Robbie and the Portsea Club members was well received by the crowd.
